

Notes: These words and phrases were gathered during travels on the roads of Northern India-- all were seen on the backs or bumpers of trucks, vans, and other forms of transport, often handpainted with colorful decorations. The horn is used as a signal in passing. The dipper is the high/low beam control on the headlights, also used as a signal. Tata is the most common brand name of trucks. This can be done as a round, or the different parts can be given out to different sections and layered in and out. The result of the layering is intended to be nearly as noisy and cacophonous as an Indian roadway.
